Dr. Wiersema retired in 2018 after 34 years of surveying economic plants for the GRIN-Global database of the USDA's National Plant Germplasm System. He is currently a Research Associate in the Botany Department of the Smithsonian's National Museum of Natural History. This presentation will analyze the diversity of useful plants and their uses over the entire world, with material for this analysis being derived from the 329 families, 3,391 genera, and 14,482 species of economic plants characterized in GRIN-Global
